WELCOME AND INTRODUCTION

Anup Karia and Iona Fredenburgh (Co-Directors of ProcessworkUK)

Processwork is a paradigm which brings innovative and creative change in the world around us and in ourselves. Anup and Iona will speak about the many fields in which Processwork contributes and is practiced, and its theoretical foundations. There will be information about the different seminars, events and training pathways offered by ProcessworkUK.

Jean-Claude and Arlene Audergon

are founders and lead faculty members of ProcessworkUK. They are also co-founders of CFOR, an organisation devoted to conflict resolution, community recovery, prevention of violence, and training facilitators. They would like to add their welcome – and will talk about how facilitated community interactions support the awareness needed to be less easily swept up into divisive polarisations. They'll briefly present CFOR's work in post-conflict zones, including reckoning with the legacy of colonialism. They will show a short film of their work in Rwanda with survivors and perpetrators of the 1994 genocide against Tutsi – and look at the contribution of Processwork and Worldwork to processes of reconciliation and genocide prevention.

GO DEEP - Andy Smith

Go Deep is a community building method that is played as a 'game'. Originally designed to support leadership in young people it has now been used in 7 countries on three continents in neighbourhoods and localities for all citizens. It acts as an energiser to kick start community actions and collaborative relationships and facilitates sustainable teamwork by working with edges, conflict and disturbances. It has won a Global Education award for innovation and is being researched by Lisbon University for its impact working with diversity and cohesion. Andy Smith is one of the designers and will present learning and a little taster of the Go Deep experience. He is a faculty member of Processwork UK.

FACILITATING AT THE LIMIT - Stanya Studentova

Stanya will share some of her experience working in the community mental health organisation MIND. She will use Processwork to frame issues that are pertinent in the work, especially focussing on issues of trauma and vicarious trauma. Traumatizing experiences have a profound impact on a person's life. A question that has been interesting to Stanya, is the way practitioners and indeed whole organisations are impacted by trauma, and how to facilitate and support the whole, including the client (service user) and the practitioner. Stanya is a Faculty member of ProcessworkUK.

PANEL OF PROCESSWORK PRACTITIONERS

Milan Bijelic, Sue Milner, Sonia Slany and Louise Warner

will each speak briefly about aspects of their practice, and invite questions and discussion. The range of their work includes: working with refugees and community building in Sheffield, development of initiatives around equality, diversity and intersectionality in the UKCP college of HIPC, processwork engaging with ecopsychology, environment and indigenous teachings, the development and management of Kirklees Woman Centre which has recently been nominated for a national diversity award, processwork with cancer, and in the field of music and creativity.


